**BREMF Consort of Voices** was founded in 2009 by Deborah Roberts and is now directed by James Elias. The consort is dedicated to giving dramatic and exciting performances of Renaissance and early baroque music. Their next concert is *Music Divine: Gibbons 400* as part of Brighton Early Music Festival in St Paul's Church on Thursday 16 October.

This event is part of **Brighton Early Music Festival 2025**, which runs until 26 October with more than 20 events around the city.

The 2025 Festival explores the theme of LOVE – encompassing friendship, hospitality, love of nature, and romantic love. All of our events relate to this theme in one or more ways and include the UK premiere of a French baroque opera from 1736, music for women's voices discovered in a 16<sup>th</sup>–century convent, and music for choir and orchestra inspired by the writings of Oscar Wilde.
